Description: Climate change confronts the world with a challenge of unprecedented magnitude. Its complexity and pervasiveness require an ambitious global response. To limit average temperature rises to less than 2°C, we must reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions very significantly and build links between economic growth and greener economies. Reversing GHG emissions will take time, however, and the first effects of climate change can already be felt. Ultimately, we will all feel these effects, and all of us will have to adapt. Some countries, though, are more vulnerable to climate change than others. The most vulnerable countries often lack the resources to adapt well, which is why they need international support. The European Union (EU) places climate change at the heart of its external relations, including development cooperation, and actively supports multilateral negotiations under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).
